Life Legacy

Catherine Serafin Hayes passed away peacefully on Tuesday, August 15, 2017 after 101 years dedicated to God, her family and her country. The third of nine children, Catherine was born in Stamford on September 16, 1915 to the late Peter and Mary (Ciejka) Serafin, Polish immigrants. Catherine was educated in Stamford schools and was a graduate of Stamford High School, class of 1933, and the Stamford Hospital School of Nursing, class of 1936. She began her career working for Stamford Hospital. During World War II she entered the Navy Nurse Corps. She was stationed in Naval hospitals in Portsmouth, VA, St. Albans, NY, Gulfport, MS and New Orleans, LA where she tended to troops brought in from the battlefields of the Europe. She attained the rank of Lieutenant and continued serving in the Navy Nurse Corps Reserves after the war ended. She was awarded the American Campaign Medal and the World War II Victory Medal and was very proud to serve her country. She described her experience as a Navy nurse as among the most cherished and rewarding of her life. Catherine was married to George R. Hayes, also a veteran, for thirty-three years. They were devoted to each other and enjoyed traveling together and spending time with and helping their friends and family. Aunt Kate and Uncle George were favorites at all family gatherings. For the past fourteen years, she had been a resident of the Edgehill Assisted Living Community in Stamford. She enjoyed meeting new friends, playing bridge, attending movies and presentations on current events. Catherine cherished her Catholic faith and was a lifelong member of Holy Name of Jesus Church in Stamford. In addition to her husband and parents, Catherine was predeceased by her sisters; Ann Serafin, Edna Serafin, Barbara Serafin, Mary Jakubek, and her brothers; Albert Serafin, John Serafin, and Peter Serafin. She is survived by her sister Marjorie Hogan of Stamford and many loving nieces and nephews who will miss her greatly.
