Deirdre Walsh Burr, of Stamford, CT, passed away on Wednesday, November 11, 2015 at the age of 83. Her family and friends will remember her as a wonderfully fun, creative, and elegant woman.

Deirdre subsequently began a career in real estate, working for Brown Harris Stevens and Douglas Elliman. By chance, she reunited with John S. Burr, a former fiancé from decades past. They wed in 199X, and remained happily married, restoring a farm in upstate New York and enjoying the company of their family and friends, until John's death in 2008.
