He is survived by his sister, Margaret Dadabo; many nieces and nephews, his loving daughters, Jennifer (Scott Jones) and Mary (Timothy Montague); and his four cherished grandchildren, who will carry forward his legacy of kindness, dedication, and quiet strength.

Albert's life was one of steady love, thoughtful craftsmanship, and unwavering devotion to family. He will be deeply missed and forever remembered by all who knew him.

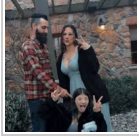
