It is with great sadness that we announce the passing of Alberto L. Johnson, who left us on Friday, May 2, 2025. Born on November 29, 1952, in Port Limon, Costa Rica, he was the beloved husband of Valerie Johnson and the cherished son of Ines H. Beechman and the late Albert “Jack” Johnson.

Alberto moved to Stamford, CT, at the age of 14 and made it his home for the remainder of his life. He was a proud graduate of Stamford High School, where he built lifelong friendships and later attended Norwalk Community College. He was a skilled tool and die maker, known for his precision, craftsmanship, and strong work ethic. Alberto worked at Pitney Bowes for 30 years and later at Omega Engineering for 8 years.
