Anne-Marie Guillaume passed away peacefully at her home in Georgia on Thursday, March 12, 2026, surrounded by her loving daughter and granddaughter.

Anne-Marie was a devoted mother, grandmother, sister, and friend whose kindness and generosity touched everyone who knew her. She truly had a heart of gold and would give the clothes off her back to anyone in need.

Born in Haiti, in the small town of Bananière (Camp-Perrin), She attended Les Soeurs de L'instruction Chrétienne school. She left Camp-Perrin at the age of 16 to settle in Port-au-Prince, later she made the courageous decision to migrate to the United States in the late 1970s, leaving her two children behind in pursuit of a better life. Through hard work, determination, and sacrifice, she was able to reunite her family in the 1980s. She made her home in Stamford, Connecticut, where she worked tirelessly over the years. Her employment included positions at Jet Industries, Meyers Manufacturing Co; Doral Arrowwood Hotel; Columbia Flowery and Le Méridien Hotel (Boston). She also spent two years living in Massachusetts before returning to Connecticut after the heartbreaking loss of her son, Emmanuel. She later retired from Columbia Flowery and found her greatest joy in being a grandmother. She cherished every moment spent with her beloved grandchildren, Adja and Thialal.

She was full of life; outgoing, warm, and full of laughter. Anne-Marie loved music, dancing, and telling jokes. She had a natural gift for making people smile and brought light into every room she entered. She also loved to cook and was known as an exceptional cook, everyone loved her cooking. Her home was always open, and she took great joy in feeding anyone who came to her home.

She is survived by her daughter, Johanne; her granddaughters, Adja and Thialal; her stepchildren, Jean-Claude and Marie Yolene Occenad; her brother, Valerie, Flaubert; her sisters, Paulette and Marie Carmelle; and a host of nieces and nephews: Michelle, Vanessa, Katherine, Stephane, Valerie Jr., Jefferey, Jeniffer, Janika, and cousins: Claude, Rouzier, Macdèle & Family, her longtime companion, Jacques René, her beloved, Jimmy Lamothe.

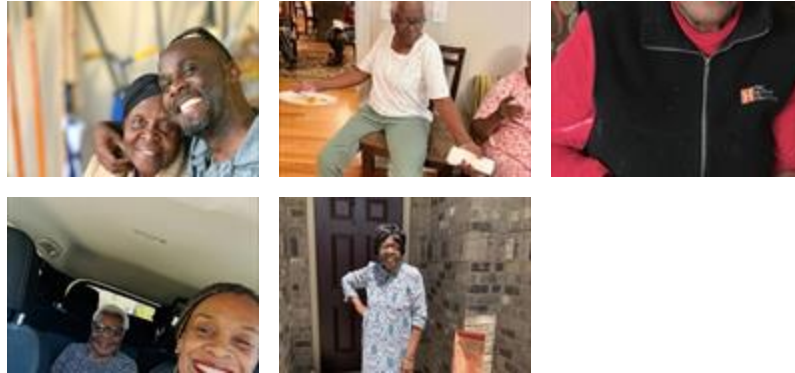
