Anthony A. Sauve, of Stamford, Connecticut, died unexpectedly, on September 29 at the age of 58. He was predeceased by his father, James A. Sauve. Anthony completed his studies at Princeton University where he received his PhD in organic chemistry and completed his Post-Doctoral work at the Albert Einstein Medical College. Anthony went on to Weill Cornell Medical College in 2004 where he started his career as an Assistant Professor, and later became a tenured Associate Professor of Pharmacology.

Anthony was a cherished member of the Pharmacology faculty. With great passion, he worked tirelessly in scientific medical research, solving mechanisms of several important enzymes. He was a prolific inventor with multiple patented discoveries, and he greatly enjoyed teaching the next

generation of scientists and technicians. Anthony was a brilliant chemist and pharmacologist whose research in the area of enzymes that use nicotinamide to regulate the processes of DNA repair, gene silencing and longevity was innovative and important for human health. The product TRU NIAGEN and others developed based on his inventions have been used worldwide benefiting human metabolism and overall health.

Anthony had a zest for life, never compromising the moments he was given. He loved reading, fishing and traveling, especially in the desert under the hot summer sun. Growing up, he loved sports. He played football while in high school and showed the same determination in sports that he did in his academic and professional career.

Recently, Anthony and Julia moved to their dream home in Stamford. The quiet tranquility contrasted with the hustle and bustle of the city. In the brief time they had together there, he enjoyed swimming and playing basketball in the pool. He enjoyed grilling on the patio, and sitting and talking at the fire pit while playing his favorite music. He also enjoyed riding his brand-new tractor taking care of the beautiful lawns with various flowers blooming seasonally. His favorite picture is hanging on the wall in his home office. The picture which he named "Sailing to Connecticut" helped to provide inspiration and purpose. Today, he will be laid to rest where his ship's course was set.
