Christine Marie Betts, of Stamford, Connecticut, passed away suddenly on March 19th, 2020 at the age of 67 in her home with her loving husband, Richard Betts, by her side. She was a loving wife, mother, grandmother, sister, aunt, and friend to all she met. Christine never met a stranger or a challenge she couldn't overcome. She will be forever missed by the many relatives, friends, students, and families she supported throughout her life.

Christine was born on January 1st, 1953 in New Haven, Connecticut to her loving parents William and Marjorie O'Kane of Hamden, Connecticut. Christine moved with her parents and eight brothers and sisters to Stamford when she was a child and attended the public schools. Christine graduated from Stamford High School in 1970 and went on to earn bachelors and master's degrees in the field of education. Christine taught high school special education for over 38 years in the community at both Westhill High School and AITE.

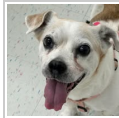
