November 22, 1925 - January 6, 2022

Elizabeth (Libby) Chiappetta of Stamford, CT passed away peacefully at Stamford Hospital on Thursday, January 6, 2022. She was 96 years old. Libby was born in Stamford, CT the daughter of the late Mary (Yacknick) and Anton Ryba. Libby was a loving wife, mother, grandmother and great grandmother.

Libby is survived by three daughters, Judy Calorossi and her husband Michael of Danbury, Debra Webb and her husband Michael of Danbury, and Laurie Chiappetta and her husband Victor of Stamford; a son, Don Chiappetta and his wife Patricia of Stamford; and a brother-in-law Donald Palmer of Stamford. 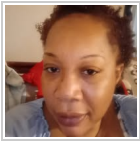
