She was that rare person who left the same loving impression on everyone who knew her. She was always a very loving and elegant lady.

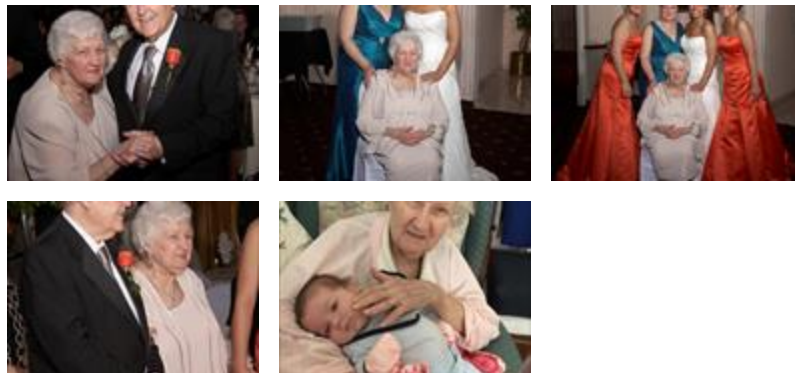
