Frank J. Lopiano, Jr., 84, devoted husband of the late Arlene G. (Jay) Lopiano, a Stamford native, passed away peacefully with family by his side on Friday, August 6, 2021. Frank was born on May 13, 1937 in Stamford, Connecticut and resided in Port St. Lucie, Florida. He was the son of the late Frank Joseph Lopiano and Filomena (Fanny) Vitti Lopiano.

Frank attended school in Stamford and was a graduate of St. Basil's High School. He attended Bridgeport University where he was a student of mechanical engineering. He worked for Hoffman Fuel Company where he excelled at his craft and built his own successful business operating in the greater Stamford area.

Frank had a love of the sea at an early age, purchasing his first boat when he was twelve years old. 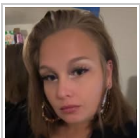
