George F. Emmons, age 72, of Stamford, died suddenly at home on Thursday, January 18, 2018. Born June 22, 1945 in Endicott, NY to George and Natalie Emmons, he grew up primarily in Rye Brook, NY. After graduating from Archbishop Stepinac High School in White Plains, NY, he earned a Bachelor's degree in History from the College of the Holy Cross and a Masters in Communications from Syracuse University. George was drafted into the U.S. Army and served in the Vietnam War as a motor pool clerk until his honorable discharge in 1970. George spent his career in advertising sales for both radio and television. He moved to Connecticut in 1975, living in Bridgeport for 19 years and Stamford for 22 years. George was an avid golfer, history buff, movie quoter and New York Mets fan, George was very engaging and kind to everyone he encountered. He was a man of simple needs, treasured his family most, and was the most wonderful, caring, and doting father. He is survived by his two sons, Michael G. Emmons of Stamford and Christopher T. Emmons of Bridgeport; sisters Mary (Neil) Tergesen of Rye, NY and Anne (Edward) Murphy of Winnetka, IL; four nieces and three nephews; fourteen grand-nieces and nephews, many extended family and friends. A memorial service celebrating his life will be held 2 p.m. to 4 p.m, on Saturday, February 3, 2018 at Bosak Funeral Home, 453 Shippan Ave, Stamford.
