On January 12, George John Vlahos passed away peacefully in his sleep just shy of his 92 birthday. He followed his beloved wife Amy Mallas Vlahos who passed last May. George was a personnel manager for Refined Sugars in Yonkers for more than twenty five years. In his sixties he began a second career as a math and science teacher in the Yonkers public schools. George loved the beach and surf fishing, spending many happy family vacations on Long Beach Island, NJ. He and Amy enjoyed traveling, taking many excursions after retirement.
