Jeffry Miles Weiss, age 71, died peacefully at Norwalk Hospital on March 25, 2014 surrounded by family and friends. He was the son of the late Sidney and Janet Weiss and lived in Stamford for many years. He graduated from Stamford High School in 1960 and from the University of Connecticut in 1964. Though their travels took them around the world, he always said his favorite trip was the annual vacation to the Caribbean with all of his children and grandchildren. He had many loyal friends from all stages of his life. He was kind, warm, funny and had a smile that lit up the room. He was the life of the party and also threw a great party.

He is survived by his wife of 46 years, Mary Jo – his two sons Greg (Shari) of Laguna Hills, CA, and Randy (Kate) of Norwalk, CT, two brothers Alan

(Susan) of Huntington, NY and Mitch (Martha) of Ithaca, NY, his niece Kate Gilmore (Eric), nephew Tim Weiss and his five beloved grandchildren – the joys of his life – Bailey Weiss, Britney and Christian Arcadio and Brian and Matthew Weiss.
