Joseph Dunios Magloire was born on April 1, 1939 raised in Jacmel, Haiti by his mother Brunelia Bruce and his father Duvenios Magloire. Unfortunately, at the age of nine he lost his father and was raised by his mother who dedicated her life to making sure Joseph and his siblings were able to receive an education. He has one brother and two sisters that are still living: Victor, Jeanette and Gisel. He also has one deceased sister: Rosana. Joseph was the oldest.

Dunios become a man who stood on great moral and principles. This type of home training from his mother followed him throughout his life and was used as a compass to how he lived his life in the near future.

In 1964 brother Dunios decided to accept Christ as his Lord and Savior. He became very active in his church in Haiti (L'Eglise de Dieu de Bizoton) under the Leadership of Pastor Merejuste Florestal. Since then he stayed the course and continued to build a lasting relationship with our Father above.

The duration of a 51year marriage between him and his Wife Louise Clairmelie Magloire lead to five children: Jimmy, Johnny, Guerino, Brunette, Clerdune, and three steps children Frantz, Gerald, Flerzilia. He has twenty grandchildren: Judson, Clifford, Wilner, Jimmy Jr, Jasmine, Jessica, Nehemie, Williana, Sonia, Najah, Anyia, Nathanie, Takia, Renuca, Marlon, Brain, Miya,

Myra and Cara. He also has eight great grandchildren: Kiara, Jayauih, Alaysia, Ariel, Wilner Jr., Jaden, Jonathon Jr., and Legacy.

In search of a better life for his family, brother Dunios decided leave Haiti and enter to the United States in 1978 to begin a new chapter for him and his family. Being the hard-working man that he is, he was able to send for his wife and his five children in 1982. By 1986 the other three step children were able to enter the United States and all of us were reunited again under the same roof.

His main job was at Smith House for 25 years and then he retired in 2003. Joseph became a member at New Jerusalem Church, pastored by Gesson Prosper, where he later became a Deacon. He was recognized for his missionary work throughout the years while attending New Jerusalem.

Joseph loved to listen to music and play instruments such as the harmonica, accordion and piano. Most of the instruments he learned to play were self-taught.

Joseph Magloire died on March 20th, 2020. He was a husband, father and hard-working man. He will be deeply missed by his family, friends and all who knew him.
