Joseph Warren Street, "Gampy", joined his beloved bride in heaven on the morning of Thursday, September 28, 2017 at Autumn Lake Healthcare in Norwalk. He was 98 years old. Joseph was born in Stamford, CT on October 20, 1918 and was one of two sons born to the late Benjamin Warren Street and Mary O'Boyle Street. He was a proud veteran of the U.S. Army and was awarded the Purple Heart for his service during WWII. He served in the 26th infantry "Yankee division", 2nd battalion, 101st regiment in the European theatre and took part in the Battle of the Bulge. He was an avid sports fan, former employee of Reingold Beer, USPS and prewar ship builder. He lived a long life, nearly 99 years filled with the love of all those who knew him.
