



Joseph S. Szczepinski

October 9, 1942 - November 2, 2023

Joseph Stanislaus Szczepinski, 81, died on November 2, 2023, at Stamford Hospital surrounded by family. He was born October 9, 1942, in Brooklyn, NY, he was the son of Josephine Gajkowska-Szczepinski and Stanley Szczepinski. His mother passed with his birth and was raised by family members Eugene and Celia Kozlinski that he knew as his parents.

Joseph was affectionately called Stanley or Stosh, which means baby boy in Polish, by his family. He graduated from Stamford High School, Class of 1961. Following graduation, he proudly served with the U.S. Airforce as an airman (E-3). His technical service was a jet engine mechanic where he was mostly stationed in Germany and Turkey until his Honorable Discharge in August of 1967. Upon returning home to Stamford, Connecticut he began working for Machlett Laboratories/Raytheon as a fabricator. After retirement, he worked as a security officer to fill some of his days.

He loved sports cars and the rev of an engine as demonstrated with some of the cars that he had owned. He also was a vinyl record enthusiast. In 1959, after purchasing his first Buddy Holly LP in Times Square, he was hooked. Over the years he added many genres to the collection believing that music just sounded better on vinyl.

In addition to his parents, he was predeceased by his sisters Dorothy

Northrop, Vicky and Stella Szczepinski, and his brother Eugene Szczepinski. Survived by his daughters Karen Knoff of Yucca Valley, CA and Lorraine Muha of Norwalk, CT; his brother Fred Stevens of Peoria, AZ and sisters Josephine Kozlinski-Springer of Stamford, CT and Donna Kozlinski of West Warwick, RI; as well as by many nieces, nephews and cousins.
