Leoncio Armando Martinez, a long time resident of Stamford, CT passed away peacefully on August 25, 2018. Leoncio was born in Cerro de Pasco, Peru on February 6, 1932 to the late Leoncio and Juana (Hurtado) Martinez. He was 86 years old at the time of his passing.

Leoncio was a graduate of the Colegio Guadalupe in Lima, Peru. He worked at Ciba Geigy Pharmaceutical in the accounting department in Lima, Peru before coming to the United States in 1972. He worked at Greenwich Country Day School for many years. He also worked for Cliggott Publishing in Greenwich as head of the mailroom.

He married his wife Maria Dunn in Huancayo, Peru on December 10, 1998. They often traveled together to Peru and Argentina. They enjoyed the theater especially attending many shows at the Westchester Dinner Theater. Mr. Martinez was a member of Evangelical Community Church in Stamford. He enjoyed watching the Yankees, the Knicks and of course, soccer. Leoncio loved spending time with his family. His grandchildren were a constant source of joy to him.
