



Louis S. Pannone

January 7, 1959 - November 4, 2022

Louis S. Pannone passed away on Friday, November 4, 2022. Known to friends and family as 'Louie' and 'Lou', he was born in Greenwich, Connecticut on January 7, 1959 as the first child to parents Louis and Patricia Pannone, and later raised a family of his own in Stamford, Connecticut. He will be fondly remembered by all for his unabashed sense of humor, and the dedicated and selfless way in which he cared about others.

As soon as Louie could drive, he began volunteering his time with the local fire department, paving the way for a lifelong career in public service, helping others in their time of need. In 1980, he became a Dispatcher and Special Police officer for the Greenwich Police Department. He then went on to join the Patrol Division, and was promoted to Computer Sciences Technician in 1995.

In 2004, Louie was promoted to Sergeant and in 2016, became a Lieutenant. He was respected by his fellow officers and the community. Current police chief James Heavey is quoted as saying, "Lieutenant Pannone was a servant leader who dedicated his entire life to serving his hometown of Greenwich. He will always be remembered for his candor and loyalty to the men and women of the Greenwich Police Department."

He will also be missed in the community where he was raised and spent his

life serving. Louie was a fixture at Greenwich High School football games (a school where he himself attended). In addition, his personnel file is a testament to his lifetime of service; full of citations, letters of gratitude from residents, and lifesaving awards spanning his career.

Louis is predeceased by his mother Patricia Pannone. He is survived by his father Louis M. Pannone, children, Daniel Pannone, William Pannone, and Caroline Slack. He is also survived by brothers Marc Pannone and Gregory Pannone, sisters Julia Mitchell and Patricia Crawford, and six nephews and nieces.
