Marianne Infanti Makrinos passed away peacefully on January 22, 2019 with her loving family by her side. Born in Greenwich on August 2, 1941 she was the daughter of the late Rocco Infanti and Caroline Santoro Infanti.

Ms. Makrinos began her working career with American Machine & Foundry Atomics Division as an executive administrative assistant. After five years of employment the division moved from Greenwich to Lancaster, PA where she relocated. Upon her return to the Greenwich area, she met her now deceased ex-husband and together they created one of the country's first, third-party radiology equipment sales and service companies, ELM X-ray.

Ms. Makrinos is survived by her two children, a son Mark Makrinos of Stamford, CT and a daughter Cheryl Makrinos and her husband John Lucarelli of Greenwich, CT.
