Rita Troshynski, nee Lydon, of Stamford, CT, passed away on Monday, May 22, 2017 at her home surrounded by her loving family. She was born in Ewing, Nebraska on October 2, 1939 and was the daughter of the late Leo and Mary Ellen (McCaffery) Lydon. Rita was 77 years old. Rita was preceded in death by her husband of 52 years, Hugh Troshynski in 2013, her sister, Joan Pofahl, a brother in infancy, and brother-in-law Martin Pofahl. Once married, Rita, and her husband Hugh, moved to Lincoln, NE where Rita took a job selling furniture at Miller and Paine, which planted the seed for her designer skills. Successful in sales, she was then offered a job in NYC at Stetson Hats. This is the job that moved her and her family to CT. She went on to have a flourishing career in New York as a Marketing Specialist for artists and designers. Rita was creative with her work, and expanded into interior design and color consulting, working for many popular retailers in the

CT area, including United Housewrecking, Bassett Furniture, and Rings End. She only stopped working when her illness prevented her from doing so. It was her absolute passion. A creative person, with a giving heart, Rita volunteered around CT contributing in many ways. She helped at Sound Waters (Stamford), she was a Eucharistic minister and taught religious education for many years at her parish, St Bridget's in Stamford, CT. Rita touched many people in many different ways. She was a cherished soul who will be missed by several. She was known around Fairfield County as the "hat lady", never going anywhere without a beautiful hat and matching outfits that stopped people in their tracks. She had requested that if you are planning on attending her funeral services that you avoid dressing in black only. She'd much rather see her family and friends dressed in festive colors, with pink being her favorite, in celebration of a life well lived.
