July 4, 1944 - March 30, 2021

Samuel Nyack, 76, of Stamford passed away unexpectedly on Tuesday, March 30, 2021. He was born to the late Ramcharan and Sukhia Nyakh on July, 4, 1944 in Siparia Trinidad, W.I. He was the ninth child of thirteen being born.

Samuel entered nursing school St. Ann's Hospital Port-Of-Spain in Trinidad, W.I. August 9, 1965, and graduated on September 2, 1968. He worked in various hospitals where he specialized in psychiatric care.

Sam migrated to the U.S. in the late 1980's. He worked with several families as a caregiver in Greenwich, Stamford, New Canaan, and even moved to North Carolina for several years. He retired in 2008 and moved back to Stamford.

Sam was very hospitable from the groundskeeper to security guard in his building. Sam loved to host family and cook, drink, and reminisced about his time in Trinidad. His joyous moments were his grandchildren, their laughter and hugs.
