Santo Sebastian Carta, known as “Ace” and “Sonny”, died peacefully in his home after a long illness. His beloved wife of 58 years, and loving daughters were by his side.

Born in Middletown, CT, moved to Stamford, CT as a small child where he lived most of his life on the West Side. He resided in Milford, CT since 1977.

An avid fan of the Yankees and all sports especially football. He enjoyed playing cards with friends and family, going to the Mohegan Sun casino, taking drives in the car, and riding his lawn tractor around the yard.

He was happiest when his home was filled with the laughter of his family and many friends whom he loved and adored. with family at the Midway Diner owned by his late uncle Tommy Uva, and the Hubba-Hubba owned by his late brother Patsy Carta. He retired from the City of Stamford, Board of Education where he worked as a Head Custodian, spending most of his career at Rippowam and Westhill High schools.

He is survived by his beloved wife, Miriam Treat Carta; two daughters, Kelley Carta and her loving partner Mollie Gross and Kim Carta Becker and husband Richard Becker; three sisters, Grace Silvestris and her husband Frank Silvestris, Jean Fuda and her husband, Robert Fuda, and Helen Migliaccio and her husband Frank Migliaccio; and three sister in laws, Judi Carta, Lenore Carta, Rosemary Treat Walsh; and by many cousins, nieces, nephews, great nieces and great nephews, several aunts and uncles.
