Stella Fox peacefully passed away at her home on April 6, 2017. She was born in Stamford, CT on April 20, 1921 to the late John Baldyga and Catherine Homa Baldyga, and was the beloved wife of Edward Fox who passed away in 1987. Stella was 95 years old. Stella graduated Stamford High School with the class of 1939 and was employed by Conde Nast and Yale & Towne. After she married she lived in Greenwich, CT for a few years before moving back to Stamford to raise her family and continue working at Zantow Ferguson Jewelers, where she worked until her retirement and the store's closing. Stella was an active member of St. Bridget of Ireland R.C. Church where she founded the Senior Club and was its President for 28 years. She also served on the St. Bridget Advisory Board for a period of time, and was even elected "mother of the year" by the parish one year. She will also be missed by her many friends at the Glenbrook Senior Club, the Springdale Senior Club and the National Council.
