Tony Pappas, 87, of Fairfield, and longtime resident of Stamford, CT, passed away on Sunday, September 28, 2014 at Bridgeport Hospital. He was born January 13, 1927 in Stamford to the late Achillis and Panayota (Adamis) Papavasiliou.

Tony was raised in Stamford, CT and enlisted in the U.S. Navy where he served from 1944 to 1946 during World War II.
