Virginia Elizabeth Hayes was the only child of Carlo and Edith Piacentile. She was born on December 4, 1949 and spent the first 68 years of her life on Lurting Avenue in the Bronx before moving to Stamford, CT.

Virginia held a firm belief in the value of family throughout her life. She went to Catholic schools for the first 12 years of her education, and then attended the Fashion Institute of Technology and graduated with an Associate Degree. In 1975, Virginia married John Hayes and spent the next 50 years being John's wife, partner, and best friend. John and Virginia had two sons in 1979 and 1981, John and Steven, in whom they were most proud.

Virginia encountered several medical issues for the past several years, including AML (cancer), against which she fought a valiant battle for 18 months before ultimately succumbing on January 29, 2026. Virginia is survived by her devoted husband, her two sons, and her four grandchildren, Madison, Ryan, Alison and Jack. Virginia doted on her grandchildren, and loved nothing more than spending time with (and spoiling) them.
